WHY DID YOU BRING US IN?

We were facing high mortality rates among our sows. Nobody understood why we were experiencing these problems. Someone mentioned stray voltage and referred us to you. Sow deaths were high and performance was low. **History:** In December 2004, we were noticing myopathy in our sows and when we would bring them from the gestation stalls to the farrowing house they would fall down and were unable to move. We had a 4% mortality rate and by July 2005 the situation had gotten worse, with the rate having jumped to 15.5%. Sows had poor eating habits and showed poor lactation. Nobody could figure out what the problem was... could it be nutrition? Disease? Over a 6-month period we had all kinds of experts and nutritionists come in. Nobody seemed to know what was wrong. Finally, someone mentioned Agrivolt and how it deals with stray voltage problems.

We could lose up to 1 sow a day (30-31 in July).

WHAT CHANGES HAVE YOU NOTICED?

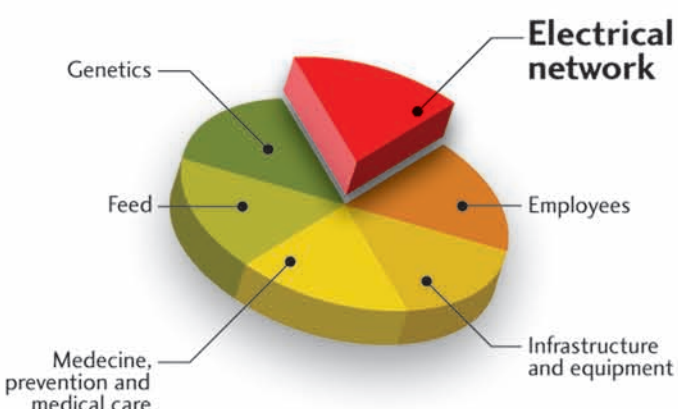
The day we flipped on the switch of the Agrivolt System all of the problems we were experiencing vanished. Sows were eating better, the mortality rate fell drastically reaching 4% in the first month. We are at 2.5% as of today (1.9% decline in the last 2 months).
